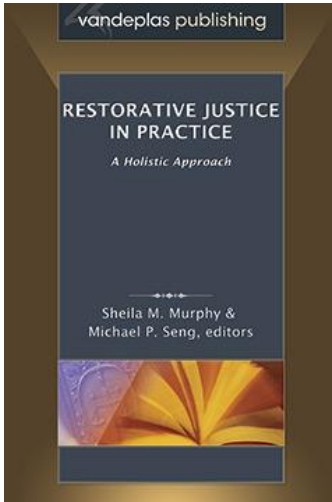


Restorative Justice in Practice: A Holistic Approach
